
Photography Exhibit and Reception Planned

The Art Committee of Quarryville Library will hold an opening reception for Photographer Amanda Clark of Willow Street on April 28, 2018, from 1 to 3 pm in the C.X. Carlson Gallery at Quarryville Library.

The exhibit is entitled The Sanctuary Project and will feature Amanda Clark's photographs of farm animals from various animal sanctuaries, farms that provide space for farm animals to live their final years in safe and peaceful places where they are respected, cared for, and loved. In Seth Dellinger's blog of April 16, 2017, for Animal Advocates of Southeastern Pennsylvania, Dellinger lets Clark explain her project in her own words: "I officially started the Sanctuary Project in January of 2017," she says. "I had photographed the animals many times on my previous visits to sanctuaries but it never clicked to start the project until the beginning of this year. I wanted to help give back to the animals." She adds, "I hope that people can see through my photographs that these animals each have individual personalities, just like people do. You can look into their eyes and know that they are feeling sentient beings like us," Amanda says. "That is the most important thing for me to show people." The reception and exhibit are open to the public and everyone is invited to attend and meet the artist. All proceeds from the sale of these photographs benefit the individual sanctuary where each photographed animal lives. The exhibit runs until June 2, 2018.

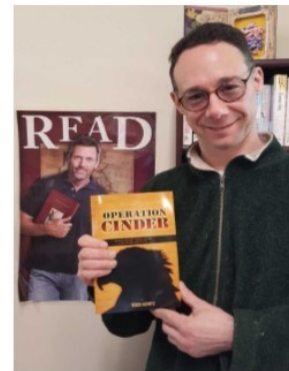

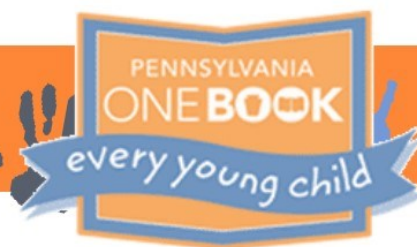

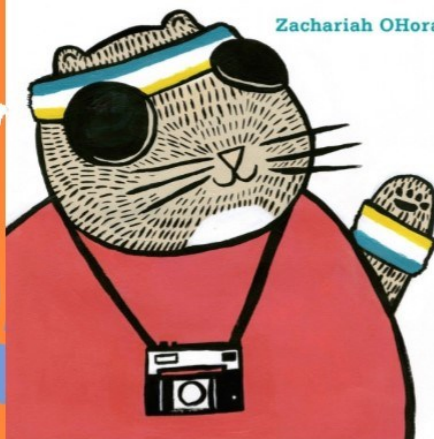


My Cousin Momo Story Time
